Referendum Question No. 4.

Shall a law(Chapter 454 of the Acts of 1923), which provides for the raising of funds toward the cost of the construction and maintenance of highways by means of an excise tax of two cents on each gallon of gasoline and other fuel used for propelling motor vehicles on the highways of the Commonwealth, said tax to be paid by the purchaser to the distributor, who, in turn, pays it to the Commonwealth, and the money to be credited to a fund to be known as the gasoline-highway fund, out of which, reimbursement is to be made to purchasers, who shall consume the gasoline or other fuel in any manner except in the operation of motor vehicles on the highways, and the expenses of carrying out the act are to be paid, fifty per cent of the balance of said fund to be distributed to the cities and towns of the Commonwealth, in proportion to the amounts which they contribute to the State tax, and this fifty percent to be expended in construction or improvement of public ways within the city or town limits, and the other fifty per cent to be expended by the State Department of Public Works on such highways as it may select, which law was approved by both branches of the General Court by votes not recorded, and was approved by His Excellency the Governor, be approved?

Shall a law(Chapter 473 of the Acts of 1923) which amends existing legislation on the same subject and provides that,subject to certain limitations,no person shall engage or be financially interested in the business of receiving deposits of money for safe keeping or for the purpose of transmitting the same or equivalents thereof to foreign countries unless he has executed and delivered a bond to the State Treasurer,or deposited securities in lieu thereof,and has received a license from the Commissioner of Banks authorizing him to carry on such business; that any money which in case of breach of bond shall be paid by the licensee or surety thereon,or the securities deposited in lieu thereof,shall constitute a trust fund for the benefit of depositors; that the license shall be revocable by the Commissioner of Banks for cause shown; that the money deposited with licensees for safe keeping shall be invested in the manner prescribed by the act; and that the violation of any provision of the act shall be punished in the manner therein prescribed,which law was approved by both branches of the General Court by votes not recorded,and was approved by His Excellency the Governor, be approved?

Toole and more than nine other registered voters of ward three; signed and sworn to by Alpino Iannaccone, a registered voter of ward six and nine other registered voters of said ward; signed and sworn to by Olive B. Looney, a registered voter of ward six and nine other registered voters of said ward, to the effect, that the said registered voters of said wards three and six believe, and have reason to believe, that the records or copies of the records made by the election officers of the said wards are erroneous; and that they believe the recount of the ballots cast in the several precincts of the above-mentioned wards, will affect the election of the following named candidates: Ernest C. Carr, William S. Howe, Thomas F. Mackey and Waldron B. Sellen, candidates for Ward Alderman in Ward Three; Richard W. Bennett, John Christopher Kelleher, Clifford T. Richardson and James C. Scanlan, candidates for Members of the School Committee in Ward Three. Lee C. Kitson, Elwood L. Mason, Paul A. McCarthy and Daniel F. Murphy, candidates for Ward Alderman in Ward Six; Elizabeth J. Carnes, Walter I. Chapman, Arthur B. Gradone, John B. Naitland and John G. Miles candidates for Members of the School Committee in Ward Six.

And the City Clerk having delivered to this Board, the boxes containing the ballots cast in all of the voting precincts in said wards three and six, at the election held therein, November 3, 1925, and this Board having given notice in writing to the several candidates interested in, and liable to be affected thereby; that it would meet at the City Hall this Tuesday, November 10, 1925 at 7.30 P.M. and Friday, November 13, 1925 at 7.30 P.M.; and if not finished on Friday, again on Saturday evening, November 14, 1925 at 7.30 P.M., for the purpose of recounting the votes cast for the candidates for Ward Alderman and Members of the School Committee in Ward Three and Ward Six. And this Board having met at the said place on Tuesday evening and opened the boxes containing said ballots cast in precincts one and two in ward three and having recounted the votes cast on said ballots for aldermen and members of the school committee and having returned said ballots to said boxes and re-sealed said boxes and certified thereon as required by law and having adjourned to again meet on Friday evening, the 13th at 7.30 P.M. and having again met at the said time and place and opened the boxes containing said ballots cast in precincts one and two of ward six and having recounted the votes cast on said ballots for ward alderman and members of the school committee of ward six, having returned said ballots to the boxes and re-sealed said boxes and certified thereon as required by law, the Board again met on Saturday evening November 14, 1925 at 7.30 P.M. and opened the boxes containing the ballots cast in precincts three and four of ward six and having recounted the votes cast on said ballots for ward alderman and members of the school committee from said ward six and having returned said ballots to said boxes and re-sealed said boxes and certified thereon as required by law.
