SUMMARY: The law provides for increases in the salaries of members of the legislature and the constitutional officers of the commonwealth

The law increases salaries of members of the legislature by an annual amount varying from $\$ 1,853$ to $\$ 17,923$. The size of the raise conferred on a pafticalar individual depends upon his position within the legislature. The law has the effect of setting the base salary for a legislature at $\$ 20.33 \%$, but under the law legislative salaries range as high as the approximately $\$ 55,920$ paid to the president of the Senabe and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

The salaries of the constitutional officers are increased either by $\$ 20,000$ in the case of the Governor or $\$ 10,000$ in all other cases. The law raises the annual salary of the Governor to $\$ 60,000$, that of the Attorney General to $\$ 47,500$, and the salaries of the Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of the Commonwealth, Treasurer and Receiver General, and the Auditor to $\$ 40,000$.

The law also amends the statutes pertaining to the organization of the offices of the Secretaries of Adminastration and Finande and of Human Services and to the Compensation of senior officials within those offices. It gives the Secretaries of Administration and Finance and of Human Semvices greater flexibility in establishing positions and setting salaries YES NO

QUESTION 1
PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION
Do you approve of the adoption of an amendment to the constitution summarized below. which was approved by the General Court in joint sessions of the House of Representatives $\qquad$ and the Senate on July 2, 1980 by a vote of 171-4, and on June 21, 1982 by a vole of 144-44?

## SUMMARY

The proposed constitutional amendment would remove the present constitutional prohibition against the use of public funds to aid or maintain private primary or secondary schools.
If would permit the Commonwealth, cities and towns to make public funds available to pupils attending private primary and secondary schools in the form of either aid, materials or services subject, however, to three specific limitations. First, the private school could'not be one that discriminates on the basis of race or colobr in its admission requirements. Second, the grant of aid must be coinsistent with the First Amendment 10 the United States Constitution which guarantees the free exercise of religion and prohibits the establishment of religion. Third, individual pupils would have to request the aid, materials or services. In addition to these three specific limitations, the amendment would authorize the legislature to enact other laws imposing conditions or restrictions on the grant of public aid, materials or services.
The proposal would also change the state constitution to allow public money to be spent to aid infirmaries, hospitals, charitable or religious undertakings if they are either publicly owned or under the control of public officials. The state constitution now prohibits such spending unless these institutions are both publicly owned and under the control of public otficials.

## QUESTION 2

## PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION

Do you approve of the adoption of an amendment to the constitution summarized below, which was approved by the General Court in foint sessions of the House of Representatives and the Senate on September 19, 1980 by a vote of 123-63, and on June 21, 1982 by a vote of 125-62?

## SUMMARY

The proposed constitutional amendment would allow the legislature to enact laws authorizing the state courts to impose the death penalty on the conviction of crimes to be specified by faw. The proposed amendment would provide that no provision of the state constitution may in the future be construed as prohibiting the imposition of the punishment of death.

## QUESTION 3

LAW PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION
Do you approve of a law summarized below, on which no vote was taken by the House of Representatives or the Senate before July 7 , 1982?

## SUMMARY

The proposed law would require that before the consinuction or operation of any new nuclear power plant or low-level radioactive waste storage or disposal facilly in the Commonwealth, the legislature must make certain findings and a majority of voters must approve the new facilly at a statewide election.
Before the question of building a new nuclear power plant could be submitted to the voters, the legislature would have to find that (1) the proposed facility is the best means for meeting energy needs based on certain economic, safety, environmental and social considerations; (2) a federally-licensed facilty exists for the disposal of the high-level radioactive waste that would be generated; (3) an approved emergency preparedness plan has been developed; (4) radioactive pollution standards have been promulgated; and (5) a demonstrated, federally-approved technology exists for decommissioning the proposed power plant.
Before the question of building and operating a low-level radioactive waste storage or disposal facility or of entering into an agreement with another state to build and operate such a faclitity in Massachusetts could be submitted to the volers, the legislature would have to find that the technology and site designated for the proposed facility are the best available based on certain economic, safety, environmental and social considerations. The legislature would also have to find that the obligatlons imposed on Massachusetts by any interstate agreement were no greater than those imposed on any other slate.

The proposal would not apply to a facility which had obtained all necessary government approvals before August 5, 1981, nor to any facillty for disposal or storage of radioactive wastes from medical or bio-research applications in Massachusetts.

QUESTION 4
REFERENDUM ON AN EXISTING LAW
Do you approve of a law summarized below, which was approved by the House of Representatives on November 10, 1981 by a vote of 108-49, and by the Senale on November 16. 1981 by a vote of $29-10$ ?

## SUMMARY

The law requires that a refundable deposit be paid for certain beverage containers sold in Massachusetts

Beverage containers of less than 32 ounces must have a refund value of at least five cents and larger containers a refund value of at least ten cents. This requirement applies to nonbiodegradable containers of carbonated soft drinks, mineral water, beer and other malt beverages, but not to containers of other alcoholic beverages, dairy products, natural fruit juices or wine. All beverage containers subject to deposit must clearly indicate the refund value on the container.

The deposit is paid by the consumer upon purchase and must be refunded when the consumer returns the empty container to a proper dealer or redemption center, so long as the container does not contain any material different from its normal contents. Dealers and distributors are also subject to the same deposit and refund on the beverage containers they handle, and are also entitled to a handling fee of at least one cent per container.
No containers can be sold in the state if they are joined together by plastic rings or any other device that cannot be broken down by light or bacteria.

The law provides a bottler a reduction in corporate excise tax of one-tenth of one cent for each reusable beverage container which the bottler sells in the first three months of 1983. The law provides for additional unemployment benefits and, if the LegIslature appropriates the funds, a job retraining program for employees of bottlers, canners, or manufacturers of beverage containers who lose their jobs as a result of this law.

The law takes effect on January 17, 1983.

Shall the Secretary of the Commonweath of Massachusetts inform the President and the Congress of the United States that it is the desire of the people of Massachusetts to have the government of the United States work
$\qquad$ vigorously to negotiate a mutual nuclear weapons moratorium and reduction, with appropriate verification, with the Sovier Union and other nations?

## QUESTION 6

Shall the Senator from this district be instructed to vote in favor of a resolution requesting the United States and the Sovie! Union to stop the nuclear arms race, and specifically to adopt a mutual, verifiable freeze on the testing, production and deployment of nuclear weapons and of missiles and new aircraft designed primarily to deliver nuclear weapons?

SUMMARY: The proposed law would reduce and then reped the $7 \frac{1}{2} \%$ surtax on Massachusetts state income taxes and would limit state tax revenue growth to the level of growth in total wages and salaries of the citizens of the state.
It would set the rate of the surtax on Massachusetts state income taxes at $3 / 3 / 4 \%$ for tax years beginning during 1986, and it would repeal the surtax for fax years beginning on or after January 1. 1987.
The allowable state tax evenues for any fiscal year and limited to the allowable state tax revenues for the prior fiscal year as increased by the everage rate of gronth of Massachusetts. wages and salaries for the three immediately preceding calendar years. For purposes of calchiating the proposed limit for fiscal year 1987. allowable stafe tax revenues for fiscal 1986 are the net tax revenues for that fiscal year, out excluding revenues derived fron the isurtax on state personal income tax. Further. if in any fiscal year the calculation of the linit results in allowable staze tax revenues less than the amount of allowable state fax revenues for the prior fear, then allowabl state tax revenues for that fiscal year shall be qqual to the allowable state fax revenues for the prior year. The revenues limited by this lam would not include non-tax revenues such as federal reimbursements, tuitions, fees and earnings on investments.
The amount of allowable state tax reveques for any fiscal year would heve to be reduced if a new state law were enacted allowing local goyernments to impose new or increased taxes or excise The reduction would be equal to the amount of revenue derived from the new tax or increase. The reduction in state tax revenueswould first take \&ffect in the fiscal year foll owing the enactment of of the new law authorizing new loca taxes or increases.
If state tax revenues exceed the limit mposed by the proposed 1 aw , as determined by the State Auditor, a tax credit would have to be granted equal to the tatal ampunt of excess tax revenue. The credit would be applied to the then current porsanal income tax 1 iabilpty of all taxpayers in proportion to their personal income

Drivers or passengers sixteen years or oider who do not wear safety belts are subject to a $\$ 15.00$ fine. The driver of a vehicle is also subject to a $\$ 15.00$ fine to each passenger under sixteen who does not wear a safety belt. This law, however, can be enforced pnly of the driver is sfopped for a yiolation of anothe motor vehicle law. Safety belt piolations with not result in surcharges on motor vehicle insurance premiums. The law also requires that when the Comanssioner of insurance sets motor vehicle insurancerates, the nates must reflect any savings attributable to increased use of safety belts.

The law also requires that all motor vehicles manufatured after september 1, 188, that are sold or registered in Massachusetts be equipped with crash protection devizes, as specified by federal regulations. This 1 la is not intended to eliminate the federal requirement for passive crash protect on devices in motop verlicles.

The law also provides that a non-binding question, unljike this binding referendum shall be placed on the 1986 general election ballot asking whether the vofers approve of the law.

QUESTION NO. 6 LAW PROPOSED BY INIIIATIVE PETITION po you approve of a law sum
by the House of Representatives on the Senate before May I, 1986?
SUMMARY: The proposed law would provide a system of voter registration by mail applicable to alr qualified voters and would eliminate statutony provisions permitting certalin persons to vote only for presidential electors.

Under this proposed law, the state Secretary would be required to prepare blank forms for affidavits of registration. The Secretary and local boards of registrars would be required to make sych forms available to any person eligible to vote in whatever puantity the person reauests, and to transmit such forms, upon written request, to any person claiming to be qualified to vofe. Registrars would a so be required to make these forms avallable at all post pffices and at lother places within their municipalities. The Secretary would be required to establish a reasonable fee for providing more than 50 forms and to prepare instructions to accompany the forms.

A person seeking to register to vate would be required to complete fhe affidavit of registration
and sign it under oath in the presence of a-witness who is at least eighteen years old. The withess rould be required to certify that the affidav thas siqned in his presence and to date the atfidayit.

## QUESTION 2

LAW PROPOSEO BY INITIATIVE PEITIION
Do you approve of a law summarized below, which was disapproved by the House of Representatives on May 3, 1988, by a vote of 24-123, and on which no vote was taken by the Senate before May 4, 1988?

## SUMMARY

The proposed law would repeal state law requiring that the wages, including payments to health and wellare plans, paid to persons employed in the construction of public works be no less than the wages paid locally under existing collective bargaining agreements and understandings, or by the municipality, for the same kind of work. Under the proposed law, the Commissioner of Labor and Industries would no longer set wage rates for such work or classify jobs.
The proposed law would also remove the Commissioner of Labor and Industries' authority to set the wage rates of employees of contractors who move office furniture and fixtures for the state or a county, city, town or district, and remove the Commissioner's authority to set the wage rates of operators of vehicles and other equipment engaged in public works.
The proposed law would not change the way wages are set for laborers employed by the state Department of Public Works and the Metropolitan District Commission.

## QUESTION 3

LAW PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION
Do you approve of a law summarized below, which was disapproved by the House of Representatives on May 2, 1988, by a vote of 2-150, and disapproved by the Senate on May 3, 1988, by a vote of $0-34$ ?

## SUMMARY

The proposed law would require the Commissioner of the Department of Food and Agriculture to issue regulations to ensure that farm animals are maintained in good health and that cruel or inhumane practices are not used in the raising, handling or transportation of farm animals.
The Commissioner would issue regulations, effective within four years after passage of the proposed law, about the surgical procedures used on farm animals, the transportation and slaughter of farm animals, and the diet and housing of those animals. The Director of the Division of Animal Health could issue exemption permils for a period of time up to one year and one half to any farmer.
Under the proposed measure, an unpaid Scientific Advisory Board on Farm Animal Welfare comprised of veterinarians and animal scientists would also be established within the Department of Food and Agriculture. The Board would examine animal agricultural practices, issue for publication certain reports on farm practices, and make non-binding recommendations to the Commissioner about specific regulations. If appropriated by the legislature the Board may allocate an annual sum of not more than ten cents per Massachusetts citizen to assist farmers in adopting methods which are consistent with the purposes of this law.
The Director of the Division of Animal Health would be responsible for enforcing regulations issued as a result of this proposed law. Persons who violate the new law would be punished by a fine of up to $\$ 1,000$.

## SUMMARY

This proposed law would change the state income tax rate, affect language contained in certain tax provisions, and regulate the satting of lees by state agencies and authoritits. The proposed law would set ine siate income eax rate on Pari 8 arabale income (in general, meant compenssation, alimony, Massachuselis bank interest, rental income, pension and annuily income, and IRAKkeogh deductions, which would be laxed at $5 \%$.
The proposed law also provides that the fee imposed by any state agency or authority shall be no more than the fee that was in effecl on or befora Junn 30, 1988. The state Secretary of Adminisiration would determine the amount to be charged for any service, registration, regulation, license, fee, permil or other public funclion, except tor the rates of tuition or fees at stale colleges and universilies or any lees or charges relative to the administration and operation of the state couns. Any increase or decrease in a lee, or the establishment of any new fee, would require the approval of the Legislature. Any increase in a lee would not apply to persons 65 years of age or older: No state agency or authority could collect any fee which exceeds the administrative costs direclly incurred by the state agency or authonity to produce aphd process the application for any license or permiit. The Secretary of Administration must repon information concerning fees to the Legisilaure on an annual basis.
The proposed law provides thal for tax peniods commencing on or atiter January 1, 1991, language in certain provisions of the Massachuselts general laws relating to taxes shall be the same as it was on August 2, 1989, or the effective date of the proposed law, whichever
language vieds less tax revenue. The lax provisions affected include sections relatino to the language yieds less tax revenue. The lax provisions aflected include sections relating to the surfax on business income, corporate excise taxes, S corporation laxes, taxes on security corporations, taxes on Part A income (in general, unearned income), bank taxes, excise taxes on alcoholic beverages and cigarettes, excise taxes on deeds, astate taxes, payments to the
Commormealth relating to horse and doo racing, payments to the Commonweallh relating to boxing and sparring malches, taxes on utilify companies, gasoling taxes, taxes on insufance companies excise taxes on motor vehicles, taxes on urban redevelopment corporations, sales lax, use tax, room occupancy excise lax, property laxes, and laxes on proceeds from
rallies and bazaars. Thie proposed law.

## SUMMARY

This proposed law would limit the way in which business and cerlain nonprofit corporations could contitibute to and spend money on campaijons invalving an initiative, referendum or other questlon submitted to the vaters at
a state or local election. The proposed law would require ballot committeas a slate or local election. The proposed law would require ballot committeas
organized lo support or oppose any question submilted lo lho voters lo disclose promptly certain contributions made late in the campalgn: would establish proeedures that business and certain nonprolit corporalions would have to follow in order to spend money on ballol question campaigns; and would establlsh volunlary spending limits for ballol committees.

The proposed law would requile a ballot commiltee to report to the state Onfice of Campaign and Political Finance, within one business day of recelpt, the
name, address, occupation and employer of any person or organization maikng a contribution or $\$ 1,000$ or more, il the contribution was made before the date of the election but after the closing date of the last official campaign contribution report.
Under the proposed law, business and cerlain nonprofil corporations would be prohiblied from making contributions or expendilures lo support or oppose a ballol question, but would be permitted to create and solicil contribulions to a sapirate fund to be used to support or oppose a ballot question. A separale
fund would be required for each ballot question on which the corporation intended to solicit contributions. The corporation would be required to report intended to solicit contributions. The corporation would be requited to report
all amounts spent to establish and administer tie fund to the Orfice ol Campalgn and Political Finance, and to a clty or lown if the fund were established to influence the vote on a local ballot question.

Contributions to the separate fund coutd be solicited only from members or stockholders, officers and directors, and employees at a policymaking, managerial or professlonal level. Coercion, job discrimination and linancial reprisals as methods of solifiling contributions would be profibited. Nonprolit corpora-
tions that are formed for tha purpose of promoting political Ideas, do not engape In buslness aclivilies, have no shareholders, and do not have business corpo rations as members or accept more than one percent of their revenues from such corporations would be exempl from these provisions. A business organdzation that violated these requirements could be fined up to $\$ 50,000$, and any difrector or agent of a business organization who volates or authorlzes the vilalation of thase requirements could be fined up to $\$ 10,000$ and/or imprisoned
for up to one year.

The name of a person could nol be printed on a primary or Menerai election ballof as a candidale for the oftice of United Staies Senator (Ir) In Massachuselits, it the person had served two conseculive terms (wetve yearsike
that oflice in the seventeen years prior to the end of the then-current term of ofice. The proposed law would nol prevenl any voter from casilng a write-in vale for any person as a candidate for any oftice.
II a person made ineligitie by the proposed law to have his or her name printed on the ballot as a candidate tor the office of liautenant Governor, Secretary of Slate. Slate Treasurer. State Auditor, Slate Altorney General, Governor's Councillor, Stale Representaitive or Slate Senator were stille elected to that office by writo-in vole, the person would serve withour a salary. If such a person were elecied to the Senator, the person would also serva without payment for certain expenses.
The currenl lerms ol the persons servino as Govermor, Leulenant Goven Governor's Councillor, State Representalive, State Senator, Uniled Slates Representative from Massachusetts, and Uniled States Senalor frum Massachusetis, would nat be counted for purposes of the proposed law. ## QUESTION 1

## LAW PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION

Do you approve of a law summarized below, on which no vote was taken by the Senate or the House of Representatives before May 1, 2002?

## SUMMARY

This proposed law would provide that no income or other gain realized on or after July 1, 2003, would be subject to the state personal income tax. That tax applies to income received or gain realized by individuals and married couples, by estates of deceased persons, by certain trustees and other fiduciaries, by persons who are partners in and receive income from partnerships, by corporate trusts, and by persons who receive income as shareholders of " $S$ corporations" as defined under federal tax law. The proposed law would not affect the tax due on income or gain realized before July 1, 2003.
The proposed law states that if any of its parts were declared invalid, the other parts would stay in effect.
A YES VOTE would eliminate any state personal income tax for income or other gain realized on or after July 1, 2003.
A NO VOTE would make no change in state tax laws.

boveriges. Except where the proposed law has dillerent lerms, the sanhoribes would have to use the same procedures that apply to olher licenses for the retail sale ol alcchalic beverages which are nol to be consumed on the seller's premises, and lhal apply in thy 10 issuance, renewal, suspension and lerminalion of licenses for relail sales ol alcohalics and the operation of holders of such licenses. Local authorlites could sel leas ior ine operations ol hoiders of such licensess, would govern licenses to sell wine al lood slores, A YES VOTE would create a new calegory of licenses for tood siores to sell wor issuing and renewing such licenses.

Thls proposed law would allow licensed and olher authorized providers of child care in privala homes under the stales subsidilized chitd care system to bargain collectlvely will The relevant state agencies aboul all terms and condilions of the provision of child care services under the states' child care assistance program and its regulations.
Under the proposed law, these lamily child care providers who provide slate-subsidized child cara would not be considered nublic employees, bul if $30 \%$ of lhe provider pave written authorizalion for an employee organization to be their exclusive representalive in colledive bargaining, the slate Labor Relalions Commission would hold a secrel naill ballof election on whelher to cartily thal organization as the excluslve representative. Parts of the state's publict employee labor relations law and regulations woutd apply to lise eleclion and coliective bargaining procasses. The proposed law would not authorize providers 10 engage in a strike or other ralusal to deliver child care services.
An exclusive representalive, if cerrified, could then communicale wilh providers to develop and present a proposal to the state agencies concerning the lems and condlltons of child care provider services. The proposed law would then fequire the parties to negoliate in good failh to tyy to reach a binding agreemenL il the agreed-upon lerms and condicost items agreed to by the parties had been approved by he slate Leoislature. II any actions laken under the proposed law required spending state funds, that spending would be subject to approprialion by the Legislature. Any complainl that one of the parties was refusing to negotiale in good laith could be filed with and ruled upon by the Labor Relalions Commission. An exclusive representalive could collect a fee from providers for the cosls of representing them.
An exclusive representalive could be de-centified under Connmission regulations and procedures if certain condilions were met. The Commission could nol acceppl a decarilication pelition for at leasl 2 years atter the first exclusive representative was certlied, and any such petition would have to be supported by $50 \%$ or more of the total number of providers. The Commission would then hold a secrel mail ballot election for the providers to vole on whelher to decertily the exclusive representalive

## SUMMARY

This proposed law would repeal an existing slate law that allows a qualified organization wishing to build government-subsidized housing that includes low- or moderateincome units to apply for a single comprehensive permit from a city or lown's zoning board of appeals (ZBA), instead of separate permils from each local agency or official having jurisdiclion over any aspect of the proposed housing. The repeal would take proposed housing. The repeal would take eftect on January 1, 2011, but would nol stop or otherwise affect any proposed housing that had already received bolh a comprehensive permit and a building permit for al least one unit.

Under the existing law, the ZBA holds a public hearing on the application and considers the recommendations of local agencies and officials. The ZBA may grant a comprehensive permit that may include conditions or requirements concerning the height, site plan, size, shape, or building materials of the housing. Persons aggrieved by the ZBA's decision to grant a permil may appeal it to a court. If the ZBA denies the permit or grants it with conditions or requiremenis that make the housing uneconomic to build or to onerate, the applicant may appeal to the state Housing Appeals Commithee (HAc) the site

After a hearing, if the HAC rules that the ZBA's denial of a comprehensive permit was unreasonable and not consistent with local needs, the HAC orders the ZBA lo issuß
the permit. If the HAC rules that the ZBA's decision issuino a comprehensive permit with conditions or requirements made the housing uneconomic to build or operate and the permit. If the HAC rules that the ZBA's decision issuing a comprehensive permit with conditions or requirements made the housing uneconomic to build or operate and was not consistenl with local needs, the HAC orders the ZBA lo modity or remove any such condition or requirement so as lo make the proposal no longer unecononic The HAC cannot order the ZBA to issue any permit that would allow the housing to fall below minimum safely standards or site plan requirements. If the HAC rules that the ZBA's action was consistent with local needs, the HAC must uphold it even if it made the housing uneconomic. The HAC's decision is subject to review in the courts. A condition or requirement makes housing "uneconomic" if it would prevent a public agency or non-profit organization from building or oparaling the housing excepl a a financial loss, or it would prevent a limited dividend organization from building or operating the housing without a reasonable return on ils investment.
A ZBA's decision is "consistent with local needs" if it applies requirements thal are reasonable in view of the regional need for low- and moderate-income housing and the number of low-income persons in the city or town, as well as the need to protect health and safety, promote better site and building desion, and preserve open snace if those requirements are applied as equally as possible to both subsidized and unsubsidized housing. Requirements are considered "consistenl with local needs" if more than $10 \%$ of the city or lown's housing units are low- or moderale-income units or il such unils are on sites making un at least $1.5 \%$ of the total privale land zoned for residential, commercial, or indusirial use in the cily or town. Requirements are also considered "consistent with local needs" if the application would result, in any one calendar year, in beginning construction of low- or moderate-income housing on sites making up more than $0.3 \%$ of the lotal private land zoned lor residential, commercial, or industrial use in the city or town, or on ten acres, whichever is larger.
The proposed law slates that if any of its parts were declared invalid, the other parts would stay in effect
A YES VOIE would repeal the state law allowing the issuance of a single comprehensive permil to build housing that includes low- or moderate-income units.
A NO VOTE would make no change in the state law allowing issuance of such a comprehensive pernit.

This proposed law would prohibili any molor veliCle manulaccure, slating with model year 2015 , trom selling or leasing, either directly or through a deale a new molor veficle wilhout allowing the owner to have access to the sanme dizanosilic and repair infornation made available to me manulaclurer's dealers and in-state authorized repair facilities.
The manulacurere would have to a tlow the owner, o Lhe owner's designated ins-stale independentr repar
lacility (one not affil ted with a manuacture op authorizzd deales), to oblain diagnosicic and repai information electronically, on an hourly, daill monthty, or yearly subscripition basis, for no more than lair marker value and on lerms that do nol undairy lavor dealers and authorized repair lacilities. The manulacturee would have to provide access to the informalion through a non-proprietary vehicle ilernase, using a a slandard appied in eeceral emilistave lo include the same conlent and he in the same lorm and accessible in lhe same mannoer, as is provited to the manulucturer's dealers and authoition | repar f facililies.

For vehicles, manulactured from 2002 through
model year 2014, the proposed law would requrfa a manulacurer of molor venicles sold in Massachuselts 10 make available for purchase, by vehicice owners and in-siale independenl repaii faciiises, the same ciagnossic and repara inilomation that the manulucturer makes available through an electronic system to its dealers and in-slale authooized
repair facifities. Manuzactuers would have 10 make repar raciites. Manuiacturers would have to make manner, and to the same extent, as hey do for dealers and authorized repair lacilities. The information would be available tor purchase on an hourty, daily, monthly, or yearly subscription basis, lor no more than tail makket value and on lemms that oo not unfalfity layor dealers and aulhorized repai facilliles. For vehicles manulacuured irom 2002 Itrough model year 2014, the proposed law moudd also require manuluacureres to make availabole ior purchase, by vencie umits and in-slate independent rating the same diagnosic, repair and wireless appablilites as lliose arailable lo dealers and authoizzed repair racilitites. Such lools would have to be made awailable for no move than lair markel value and on terms thal do not unialidy lavor deazers and aulthorrzed repair lacillies.
For all years covered by the proposed law, the required ciagnosicic and repair intormation would not include the inlormalion necessan to resel a velicle
